




WHAT TO EXPECT



Rainfall is still again predicted to persist over several parts of the country. (The counties which have already been affected will again be affected). Heavy rainfall storms are likely to occur in Kakamega, Vihiga, Busia, Bungoma, Kisumu, Kisii, Nyamira, Migori, Siaya, Homabay, Kericho, Nandi, Bomet, Nakuru, Elgeyo Marakwet, West Pokot, Baringo, Uasin Gishu, Trans-Nzoia, Narok, Nyeri, Muranga, Kirinyaga, Embu, Meru, Kiambu, Tharaka Nithi, Laikipia, Nyandarua, Nairobi, Machakos, Makueni, Kitui, Taita Taveta, Kajiado, Kwale, Mombasa, Kilifi, Lamu, Tana River, Wajir, Marsabit and Mandera area boarderng Ethiopia.


IMPACTS

Riverine floods are predicted to be experienced over most rivers.

Water levels in Tana River are still above emergence, i.e 6.3m.

Masinga and Kiambera dams are past full capacity. Water spillover is being experienced from the 7-forks water catchment areas.

RAIN FORECAST 7th May - 13th May



The public is advised to avoid driving through or wading in fast moving water. Those living within flood plains should remain alert as flood waters may appear even in the absence of rain.

Road-users, aviators and boat operators are advised to exercise caution.

The public are advised to avoid sheltering under trees and metallic structures to minimize exposure to lightning strikes. They are also advised to be cautious since the forecasted strong winds may damage roofs, trees, billboards.
