



WHAT TO EXPECT




Dry weather conditions (Sunny intervals) are expected across most parts of the country, with a significant reduction in rainfall likely across various regions.

However, occasional rainfall is also expected, particularly in Western, Rift Valley, Central Kenya, the Lake Victoria Basin and some parts of South East Iowlands.Counties to receive rainfall are: Kakamega, Busia, Bungoma, Nandi, Kericho, Kisii, Nyamira, Migori, Narok, Bomet, Nakuru, Nyeri, Muranga, Kirinyaga, Embu, Meru, Kiambu, Tharaka Nithi, Laikipia, Nyandarua, Nairobi, Kajiado, Machakos and Makueni

COLD TEMPERATURES

Average night-time (minimum) temperatures will be low (less than 10°C) over some parts of the Highlands East of the Rift Valley.

RAIN FORECAST 14th May - 20th May



ADVISORY

The public is advised to avoid driving through or wading in fast moving water. Those living within flood plains should remain alert as flood waters may appear even in the absence of rain.

Road-users, aviators and boat operators are advised to exercise caution.

The public are advised to avoid sheltering under trees and metallic structures to minimize exposure to lightning strikes. They are also advised to be cautious since the forecasted strong winds may damage roofs, trees, billboards.
